Chapter 1: The Finished Work of Christ

1. When Jesus cried out “Tetelestai” on the cross, what did He mean by this word, and how does it show that our salvation is complete?

2. Why can't we add anything to what Christ has already done for our salvation?

3. How does the perfect tense of the Greek word “teleo” help us understand the lasting results of Christ's work on the cross?

Chapter 2: Saved by Grace through Faith

1. According to Ephesians 2:8-9, why is salvation described as a gift of God, and what does this tell us about our own efforts?

2. What part does faith play in receiving the salvation that God offers through His grace?

3. Why does Scripture say “not of works, lest any man should boast”? How does this keep our focus on God's grace?

Chapter 3: The Spirit's Work in Salvation

1. How does the Holy Spirit breathe life into a person who is dead in trespasses and sins?

2. What does it mean that the Spirit's work is based only on what Christ has already done for us?

3. Why can't an unsaved person do anything to save themselves apart from receiving Christ's finished work?

Chapter 4: The Salvation of the Spirit

1. How is the salvation of the spirit different from the salvation of the soul, as seen in Scriptures like Ephesians 2:8?

2. What does it mean that the salvation of the spirit is a "past, completed act" for the believer?

3. Why is the gospel of grace the only message we should take to those who are unsaved?

Chapter 5: Living by Faith

1. How does living by faith after salvation help us grow in our Christian life?

2. What happens if a Christian chooses to live carnally instead of faithfully, according to God's Word?

3. How does trusting in God's grace daily prepare us for the rewards in Christ's coming kingdom?

Appendix: Clearing Up Confusion about Grace

1. Why do some people wrongly think they can earn salvation by their good works?

2. How does the Bible correct the idea that salvation depends on anything other than God's grace through faith?

3. What can we say to someone who thinks they have to add their own efforts to Christ's finished work to be saved?
